
EXTENDS: WEST TO MASSACHUSETTS AVENUE

WASHINGTON, TREMONT, AND COLUMBUS ARE THE MAIN COMMERCIAL STREET OF THE SOUTH END



SOUTH END HISTORY

1840: BOSTON WAS OVER POPULATED AND OVER CROWDED SO THE DECISION WAS MADE TO FILL IN BOTH SIDES OF THE BOSTON NECK THE SOUTH BAY MARSH AND THE BACK BAY MARSH WITH LAND IMPORTED FROM NEEDHAM TO CREATE AREA FOR HOUSING

1850: CHARLES BULFINCH CREATED THE PLAN FOR THE NEWLY ENLARGED AREA OF LAND THAT CALLED FOR ROWS OF BROOKSTONE TOWNHOUSES WITH SMALL FENCED IN YARDENS AND SCATTERED SMALL GREEN PARKS

1850-1865: FASHIONABLE AREA FOR WEALTHY YOUNG PEOPLE

1870'S: FINANCIAL CRISIS AND BANK SEIZURES CAUSED THE WEALTHY RESIDENTS TO MOVE OUT OF THE SOUTH END

TURN OF THE CENTURY: ALL OF THE WEALTHY RESIDENTS LEFT THE AREA AND TENEMENT AND LODGING STYLE HOUSING BEGAN TO TAKE OVER

ROWING AFRICAN AMERICAN POPULATION BEGAN MOVING INTO THE AREA BRINGING IN THIS NEW VIBE

1940'S: GAYS AND OTHER DIVERSE GROUPS WERE DRAWN TO THE AREA

1960'S: CRIME AND POVERTY DOMINATED THE SOUTH END AND MANY OF THE PUBLIC SPACES FELL INTO NEGLECT HOWEVER MIDDLE CLASS FAMILIES AND PROFESSIONALS WERE DRAWN TO THE AREA AND BEGAN PRESERVING BULFINCH'S ORIGINAL TOWNHOUSES



SOUTH END PUBLIC HISTORY

1973: SOUTH END LISTED ON THE NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES AS THE LARGEST URBAN VICTORIAN NEIGHBORHOOD IN THE COUNTRY

1983: NAMED A BOSTON LANDMARK DISTRICT


1990'S - TODAY: WITH BOSTON'S RENT CONTROL ENDING, RENT AND PROPERTY TAXES BEGAN RISING IN THE SOUTH END, APPEALING TO AN UPPER MIDDLE CLASS POPULATION

SOUTH END STILL RETAINS SOME AREAS OF ECONOMIC DIVERSITY, WITH AREAS OF LOW INCOME HOUSING











CHESTER SQUARE PARK













Chester Square Park: Chester Square Park

Chester Square Park was a large and elegant park that used to exist for the Chester Square community. Most of the time you find the park empty, but when there are people there they are just passing through or even engaging in illegal substances. But if you let the park invite you in and you sit down, it allows you a small opportunity to escape from the city life and relax amongst the trees. However, you cannot walk through the park because it is enclosed by brownstones. Neighbors use to stroll through the park and enjoy the outdoors, while the traffic flowed far away on the park's perimeter. In the mid 1900's the decision was made to construct interstate 93, and Massachusetts Avenue would be a main axis for Bostonians to access it. Therefore, the decision was made to construct a four lane highway that cut the park in half. Today Chester Square Park is a small reminder of a glorious and elegant park that used to exist for the Chester Square community.




BLACKSTONE SQUARE: CIRCULATION



CASE STUDY: BLACKSTONE SQUARE

Blackstone Square is a public space that is used by many and understood in as many different ways. The vast majority of people use the space to promote their own use. 
